Out Come:

Avogadro initially worked as a lawyer, but as he became increasingly interested of mathematics and physics, he went on to study them until he became the first university professor of physics in Italy. He became very famous from his hypothesis, in which he assumed that the equal sizes of different gases contained the same number of molecules at the same temperature. The number 6.02214076×10²³ "the Avogadro number" was chosen so that the mass of one mole of a chemical compound, in grams, is numerically equal "for all practical purposes" to the average mass of one molecule of the compound, in Dalton's. Thus, for example, one mole of water contains 6.02214076×10²³ molecules, whose total mass are about 18.015 grams, and the mean mass of one molecule of water is about 18.015 Dalton's. The mole is widely used in chemistry as a convenient way to express amounts of reactants and products of chemical reactions.

The Department of Chemistry has organised a seminar on "Communication Skills for Interview Proficiency" on 1st May, 2024. The seminar was hosted by Dr. Subhadip Roy, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry. The Welcome Address was also delivered by Dr. Roy. Then, Dr. Aditya Ghosh, Assistant Professor, Faculty of Liberal Arts, The ICFAI University Tripura has given a talk on communication skills. Dr. Ghosh covered various aspects of communication skills for interview proficiency:

Verbal Communication:

- Clarity and Conciseness: Participants are advised to articulate their thoughts clearly and concisely, avoiding rambling or using jargon that might confuse the interviewer.
- Active Listening: It is important to listen attentively to the interviewer's questions to
 provide relevant responses. Paraphrasing or summarizing the question before answering
 can demonstrate understanding.
- Effective Storytelling: Participants are encouraged to use storytelling techniques to
 illustrate their skills and experiences. They should structure their answers using the
 STAR method (Situation, Task, Action, Result) to provide concise yet comprehensive
 responses.

Non-verbal Communication:

- Body Language: Participants should pay attention to their body language as it can convey confidence or nervousness. Maintaining good posture, making eye contact, and avoiding fidgeting are recommended.
- Facial Expressions: Facial expressions should reflect enthusiasm and engagement.
 Participants should smile naturally and show interest in the conversation.
- Hand Gestures: Using appropriate hand gestures to emphasize key points is suggested, while avoiding excessive movements that may be distracting.

Professionalism and Etiquette:

- Dress and Appearance: Participants are advised to dress appropriately for the interview, reflecting the company's culture. Attire should be neat, clean, and professional.
- Punctuality: Arriving on time for the interview demonstrates respect for the interviewer's time.



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Courtesy and Respect: Addressing the interviewer(s) politely, using their titles and names
when appropriate, is important, Participants should thank them for the opportunity at the
end of the interview.

Handling Different Interview Scenarios:

- Behavioral Questions: Participants should prepare responses to common behavioral questions, focusing on specific examples from their past experiences.
- Technical Questions: Practicing discussing technical skills and experiences in a clear and concise manner is recommended.
- Unexpected Situations: Participants should be prepared to adapt to unexpected questions or situations. Staying calm and composed, and asking for clarification if needed, are important strategies.

Outcome:


The seminar concluded with the following outcomes:

The Department of Chemistry has organised a seminar on "Yoga for relaxation and mindfulness" on 30th April, 2024. The seminar was hosted by Dr. Subhadip Roy, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry. The Welcome Address was also delivered by Dr. Roy. Then, Dr. Subhashis Biswas, Assistant Professor, Faculty of Physical Education and Yoga, The ICFAI University Tripura has given a talk and training on Yoga, Dr. Biswas discussed various aspects of yoga for relaxation and mindfulness:

1. Understanding Relaxation: Dr. Biswas began by explaining what relaxation truly means. It's not merely the absence of stress, but a state of calmness and balance where the mind and body can rejuvenate.

2. Yoga Techniques for Relaxation (visually demonstrated):

- Asanas (Poses): Certain yoga asanas are specifically designed to release tension from the body and calm the mind. Examples include Child's Pose (Balasana), Corpse Pose (Savasana), and Cat-Cow Stretch (Marjaryasana-Bitilasana) etc.
- Pranayama (Breath Control): Breathing exercises such as deep breathing (Pranayama) help in regulating the breath, calming the nervous system, and reducing stress levels.
- Meditation: Meditation techniques like mindfulness meditation and loving-kindness meditation help in training the mind to focus, promoting relaxation and inner peace.
- 3. Mindfulness in Yoga:
- Awareness of Body: Yoga encourages practitioners to be fully present in their bodies, paying attention to sensations, movements, and breath.
- Present Moment Awareness: By focusing on the present moment during yoga
 practice, individuals develop mindfulness, which helps in reducing anxiety and
 increasing overall well-being.
- 4. Physiological Effects of Yoga: Dr. Biswas discussed how yoga impacts the nervous system, leading to a decrease in the production of stress hormones like cortisol, and an increase in the production of feel-good hormones like endorphins and serotonin.

The question-answer session was particularly interesting where many questions sprouted from the audience. Lastly Dr. Subhadip Roy, Assistant Professor, Department of chemistry, The ICFAI University Tripura delivered the vote of thanks after the question-answer session was over.

Conclusion:








Introduction: It is a regular course, conducted as an integral part of the course curriculum for the B.Sc Physics, year-II students.






Objective: To make the students aware of various yoga postures and their benefits.













A Report on Mock Interview for Placement for the Chemistry Students

Interview practice can boost the confidence of the candidates for real interviews by refine their interview skills. A mock interview is a useful way to prepare for a real interview with a potential employer. Students are allowed to practice interviewing in a similar setting so they can feel comfortable with the environment. On 1st and 2nd November, 2022 the Department of Chemistry organizes a mock interview for B. Sc. and M. Sc. chemistry final year students to provide guidance and assistance for the students to achieve their career goals.

- > To provide useful feedback in a low-stress environment.

Mock interviews are preparatory scenarios in which teachers give students the chance to experience a job interview in a safe, constructive, and familiar space before they start their careers, interviewers (teachers) observe several key qualities that contribute to a professional first impression. (i) how the student introduces themselves, (ii) whether they shake hands, (iii) their eye contact, (iv) their verbal articulation, (v) Their body language, (vi) Any visible cues that might show they're nervous.

Prolonged silence is one of the most difficult and uncomfortable challenges that students can encounter. Long silences are generally interpreted as an interviewee searching their minds for an answer and coming up dry. If that's the case, it's almost always better for interviewees to admit that they don't have an answer than to stay silent for too long. Prolonged silence can give the impression that an interviewee is figuring out how to make up an answer instead of giving an honest one. And if a student gives the impression that they're lying or uncertain during an interview, it can be hard to bounce back successfully. If it is observed that students staying quiet after asking them questions, it's smart to note it so we can discuss it after the mock interview concludes. That can lead us to learn why the student was quiet, what may have distracted them, and how they can handle scenarios like that in the future

Outcome

Freshers need to treat a mock interview session with seriousness and prepare well. For one, they can highlight their achievements apart from being proficient in their college / University curriculum. They can learn how to emphasise their strengths white presenting themselves in a dignified manner. Some simple traits to master include maintaining good manners and looking in the interviewer's eyes while talking. Any display of ability to solve problems is always a big plus point. Use the mock interview to practice the answers. Keep the answer as brief as possible. The

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questions asked during a mock interview are typically the more general employer interview questions that are asked during a first-round or screening interview. After the mock interview, the interviewer will review the interview with the candidate and provide feedback.

Conclusion:

A mock interview provides an opportunity to get a first-hand experience of the interview process. The interviewers are the individual who has fair experience in his or her respective field. The questions of a mock interview can be behavioural-based or skill-centred and aim to assess a student's capability and provide them with instant feedback. For one, going through a mock interview process helps to grow some confidence in students. It provides students with an opportunity to reflect on their non-verbal communication skills. It also allows interviewees to get a chance to make mistakes and work on rectifying them in a safe environment. The immediate feedback given will also improve students' problem-solving skills that in turn help them put forth their ideas in a better manner.













Event Report on 'Community Visit (Old-age Home)'

Date: - 21st September, 2023 Venue: - Apnaghar-Abalamban

Introduction: On 21st September, 2024, the B.A. Psychology 3rd Year students from ICFAI University. Tripura embarked on a community visit to Apnaghar-Abalamban Old-Age Home. The visit aimed to provide both material support in the form of food items and to gather data regarding the mental health and well-being of the elderly residents.

Objectives of the Community Visit:

By sharing our experiences and insights gained from the visit, we aim to promote greater understanding and empathy towards older adults in our community.
- 6. Empower Students through Experiential Learning: Finally, the visit aims to empower the participating students by providing them with hands-on experience in community engagement and service. It allows them to apply their theoretical knowledge in a real-world setting, develop empathy and compassion towards vulnerable populations, and become agents of positive change in society.

OUTCOMES OF THE PROGRAM:







INTRODUCTION

Self-defense has been a familiar concept to everyone since childhood. We are all acutely aware of the current state of Indian society and the worsening condition of Indian women within it. The sense of unease is as strong as the danger-filled environment. Assailants, whose cruelty knows no bounds, pose a threat to individuals of all ages, from young toddlers to older men and women. It is essential for everyone to learn self-defense skills to protect themselves and fight for their lives without relying on weapons. It is our collective responsibility to become our own best protectors. As the saying goes, "Self-defense is not only our right, it is our duty." – Ronald Reagan.

With this purpose, our Department Faculty of Liberal Arts had organized a workshop on Self Defense Techniques. Students from different departments participate in this workshop.

INAUGURAL SESSION

The workshop started with an inaugural speech by Mr. Uttam Acharjee (Self Defense Expert). He highlighted the key points why such kinds of workshops are required to sensitize our girl child/students to self-protect themselves in public places as well as at home. Kabita Kalai help him also to communicate with students.

OBJECTIVE OF THE PROGRAM

A self-defense workshop for university students should aim to equip them with practical skills, knowledge, and mindset to ensure their safety and well-being. Here are five crucial objectives such a workshop should focus on:

- Awareness and Prevention: Teach students to recognize potentially dangerous situations and how to avoid them whenever possible. This includes understanding personal boundaries, recognizing warning signs of aggression, and practicing situational awareness in various environments.
- Assertiveness and Boundary Setting: Empower students to assertively communicate their boundaries and say no to unwanted advances or threats. Provide techniques for assertive verbal communication and protection strategies to defuse potentially volatile situations.
- Physical Techniques for Self-Defense: Teach students practical self-defense techniques
 that are effective in real-life situations, focusing on simple yet powerful moves that target
 vulnerable areas of the attacker's body. Techniques should include strikes, blocks, escapes
 from grabs, and ground defense.
- Confidence Building: Build students' confidence in their ability to defend themselves by
 providing opportunities for practice and simulated scenarios. Encourage them to trust their
 instincts and make quick decisions under pressure.
- Legal and Ethical Considerations: Educate students about the legal and ethical aspects of self-defense, including the concept of proportionality in using force, understanding the laws regarding self-defense in their jurisdiction, and the potential consequences of their actions. Emphasize the importance of using self-defense techniques responsibly and as a last resort.

By addressing these objectives, a self-defense workshop for university students can empower them with the skills and knowledge needed to stay safe and confident in various situations they may encounter both on and off campus.

Additionally, self-defense training can cultivate empathy and a deeper understanding of the importance of respecting boundaries and consent.
- Understanding of Legal and Ethical Considerations: Students will gain knowledge of the legal and ethical aspects of self-defense, including the laws governing the use of force in their jurisdiction and the importance of using proportionate force and defence techniques. This understanding enables students to make informed decisions and act responsibly in self-defense situations minimizing the risk of legal repercussions.



The University is currently offering 52 (fifty two) programs in Management, Commerce, Engineering, Law, Teacher education, Special Education, Physical Education, English, Yoga and Library Science etc. The University strives to provide quality education with an objective to provide the students with an appropriate combination of conceptual framework and practical insight into managerial technological and legal challenges and business opportunities for grooming entrepreneurial initiatives.

Objective of the Programme:

- 1. To increase and spread knowledge regarding the new tax regime among the students.
- 2. To assess the differences between the old and new tax regime and make it understandable to the students
- 3. To ensure the students' understanding about the various methods of calculating tax.
- 4. To enhance the students' skills on tax.

Learning Outcome:

Following were the learning outcome of the Webinar:

- 1. The students learnt about the various types of taxes and how it is calculated.
- 2. The students were educated about the existing differences between the old tax regime and the new tax regime.
- 3. The students also learnt about the need and importance of paying tax.

Summarisation of the Programme:

To make the students of B.Com(H) aware regarding the recent tax reforms, the Faculty of Management & Commerce has organised the webinar on Income Tax: Old Regime vs. New Regime. The resource person for the programme was CA Vineet Rathi Senior Partner of Vineet Rathi & Associates.

The webinar began with the welcome speech by Prof. (Dr.) Sujit Deb, Dean, Faculty of Management & Commerce. It was followed by the Resource person's knowledge encrusted lecture session. In his session, CA Vincet Rathi discussed about the old and new tax regimes and distinct structures for tax payers. The old regime, characterized by higher tax rates, provides various deductions and exemptions, allowing individuals to lower their tax liability through avenues like HRA, LTA, and Section 80C investments. In contrast, the new regime offers lower tax rates but eliminates most deductions and exemptions, simplifying the tax structure. He also emphasized on the fact that the tax payers must weigh their options carefully: the old regime suits those with substantial deductions, enabling them to leverage exemptions to reduce taxes significantly, while the new regime attracts those seeking simplicity and a flat tax rate without the complexity of multiple deductions. The choice between the two depends on individual financial scenarios, necessitating a thorough assessment of one's income, deductions, and exemptions to determine the most advantageous approach for tax planning. He also highlighted in his session that the old Indian tax regime operates on higher tax rates but offers numerous deductions and exemptions, allowing individuals to customize their tax planning strategies. In contrast, the new tax regime provides lower tax rates but simplifies the structure by eliminating most deductions and exemptions. Choosing between these regimes requires a careful assessment of individual financial circumstances to determine which aligns best with one's tax planning and financial objectives.

The webinar ended with the vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Annesha Saha, Associate Professor and HOD of B. Com(H), Faculty of Management & Commerce, ICFAI University Tripura.




Fig2: CA Vincet Rathi Senior Partner of Vincet Rathi & Associates lecturing the students of B.com Honors.




Fig3: Interactive session between the students and CA Vineet Rathi






Fig.1: Prof. Sarbari Saha is communicating with the participants during the FDP




Fig. 2: Prof. Sarbari Saha is reflecting upon the importance of overcoming communi-






Fig. 3: Photograph from the interactive session of the FDP.




- History 500 Years (Gutenberg Printing Work Copyright)
- TRIPS (Trade Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Right) Agreement, 1995
 1st International Agreement governing IPR
- Conventional Copyright Protection in relation to ITs Include; Dramatic Works (must be performed/ live performance for protection); Book Publication (must be digitally available); Cinematography (film must be released); Broadcasting (available in Theatres)
- S.18 of Copyright Act, 1957 Expansion; Recent developments Use of Digital platform like OTT, Television services etc.
- IT Communication Piracy distribution of such Copyright Works to be avoided without Owner's permission (S.19); Right of Performer S.38
- Copy only 1st owner can grant permission for commercialization u/s. 17, either through Assignment, Operation of Law & Licensing.
- IT & Technology Law, 2000 Emphasizes more on Copyright Protection
- Recent Problem use of A.I. for automation or creation of similar fake work;
 indecent representation of work of the actual owner, Scan original copies to sell unaware due to advancement in technology, by A.I. one form of expression can be converted into another expression
- To combat A.I. issues Digital System Set up to be build to understand & recognize real work, Copyright grant Differ from U.S where only Natural Person is granted; India any Legal Juristic Person is granted copyright holder and protection
- One must recognize that Human Intellect is real & valuable then A.I. generated works even if it's published
- Solution Linking, DRM, Watermarking, Fair Use guidelines. Etc.



2. Dr. Pankaj Kumar, DPIIT Chair & Professor, NLUJAA, Assam

Topic:- "Patentability of Biological Invention with reference to Traditional Knowledge"



- Technology for everyone is technology everywhere
- Monopolistic Practices on Bio Invention not commercialized without proper information, Thus Patent was required
- Under Biodiversity Act,2002 Bio Invention; certain portions of profit to be shared to the Shareholder, established National Biodiversity Authority (NBA); to use those profits for the welfare of the shareholder.
- Patentability prevented wrongful use; Patents Act, 1970 including 2005 Amendment

Provided criteria for Pre & Post Grant application of Bio Invention:- Novelty with Opposition (S.25), Inventive Step (S.2 definition), Due care and diligence should be exercised, the geographical origin of the biological material used must be declared in Form 1, If the biological material is from India, permission from the NBA is required, If the biological material is not from India, the claimant must declare the country of source and geographical origin, Mentioning the geographical origin requires tracing the history or lineage of the material used, Failure to disclose or incorrectly mention the source or geographical origin of the biological material can be grounds for pre- and post-grant opposition

- Inventions not Patentable S.3 of Patents Act
- Solution: S.6 Biodiversity Act Prior Approval of NBA, SIPPR scheme for start- ups (no charge required – with a period of 4 to 3 years).






Topic :- "Two Decades of Geographical Indication (G.I.) Protection in India: Issues and Challenges"



- 1999-2003 G.I. Act was enforced; World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) was sleeping beauty before G.I. introduction (now provides appropriate protection to G.I.s)
- Rationale & Salient Features of G.I.s S.2: Uniqueness, Place of Product, People belonging to that region, Rights granted to a community, non transferable: thus, G.I was created.
- Lacunas Absence of Assigning, Licensing, Minimal protection of Natural Products (3%)
- Authorised user concept someone who only has right to Use G.I tag product, also included perpetual succession – 10 Years + can be renewed forever
- Definition 'goods' got widen for G.I. tags: Most famous Agriculture & Handloom & Handicraft goods(Maximum protection); sui generis system of protection
- Registered total G.I. tag 642 products; 343 Handloom & Handicraft, 200
 Agriculture Kesar, Mango, Darjeeling Tea etc.
- 5 Categories of different products are protected with the help of producers
- Existed gap in rights if G.I. people themselves weren't aware .i.e., Artisans themselves weren't aware due to which pre registration challenges arose
- State & Company concerned to aid with concept of 'local to global'; Post Registration 'Grey area'; no particular framework
- CoP Code of Practice (method of making G.I), since G.I products has no logo, no additional mechanism, thus an identity establishment must be present, there was also rise of insufficient registration user due to lack of awareness
- Absence of inspection scheme, no structured member; thus proposed for body a body for inspection with composition and function for quality check of G.I products for G.I. tags
- Recommendation Provide govt. Organizational scheme, post registration enforcement mechanism to be involved, States to be involved in providing funds, assistance and other necessity which is not present in post registration, G.I. Protection Council establishment Sole authority to ensure other bodies function properly, proper G.I Database, mass awareness.
