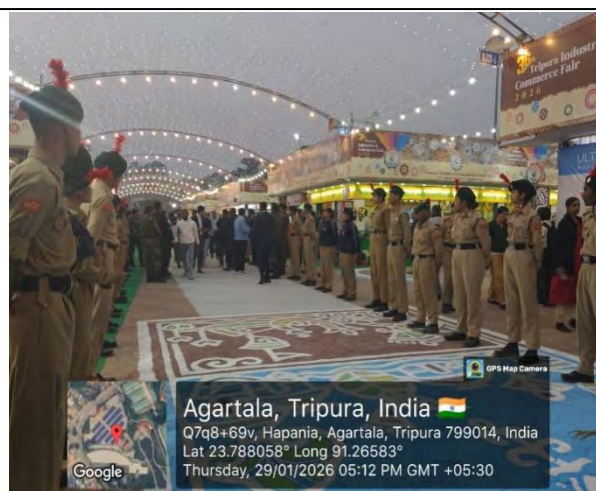
NCC FEST

YUVA AAPDA MITRA SCHEME (YAMS) TRAINING CAMP 2025



Location: Saheed Bhagat Singh Youth Hostel, Agartala, West Tripura

Date: 24th June 2025 to 05th July 2025

Organizing Authority: 13th Tripura Battalion NCC in collaboration with Tripura State Disaster Management Authority (TSDMA)

Total Participants: Approximately 500 NCC Cadets (Senior Division and Senior Wing) .

The Yuva Aapda Mitra Scheme (YAMS) training camp, conducted from June 24 to July 5, 2025, at the Saheed Bhagat Singh Youth Hostel, represents a milestone in Tripura's youth-led disaster resilience strategy. Under the rigorous supervision of the 13th Tripura Battalion NCC, the camp aimed to transform traditional NCC cadets into specialized "Aapda Mitras" (Friends in Disaster). The 12-day residential program blended high-intensity disaster management protocols with advanced military weapon training, ensuring that the youth of Tripura are prepared for both civil emergencies and national defence. The camp was inaugurated on June 24 by senior officials from the Tripura State Disaster Management Authority. The primary objective was to implement the national vision of the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) at the grassroots level. As Tripura falls under high-seismic zones and is prone to annual flooding, the 13th Tripura BN NCC curated a curriculum that emphasized local hazard mitigation. The commanding officer emphasized that the YAMS program is designed to bridge the gap between professional rescue teams (like the NDRF) and the immediate local community during the "Golden Hour" of a disaster. The core of the camp was dedicated to the YAMS curriculum, which was divided into theoretical lectures and high-pressure field simulations. Given Tripura's geography, significant time was spent on water-related emergencies. Cadets were trained in the use of inflatable boats, lifebuoys, and life jackets. Specialized instructors taught "Improvised Flotation Devices" (IFDs) using everyday objects like plastic bottles and jerrycans to save lives during flash floods. Agartala sits in Seismic Zone V. Experts from the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) conducted drills on "Victim Locating Techniques" and the safe removal of debris. Cadets practiced the "Lifting and Shifting" of casualties using stretchers and improvised carries Medical First Responder (MFR) & CPR: Daily sessions were held on basic life support. Cadets gained proficiency in: Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). Controlling heavy bleeding using pressure bandages and tourniquets. Splinting fractures using local materials. Fire Safety and Chemical Emergencies: The Tripura Fire & Emergency Services conducted live fire-fighting drills.
