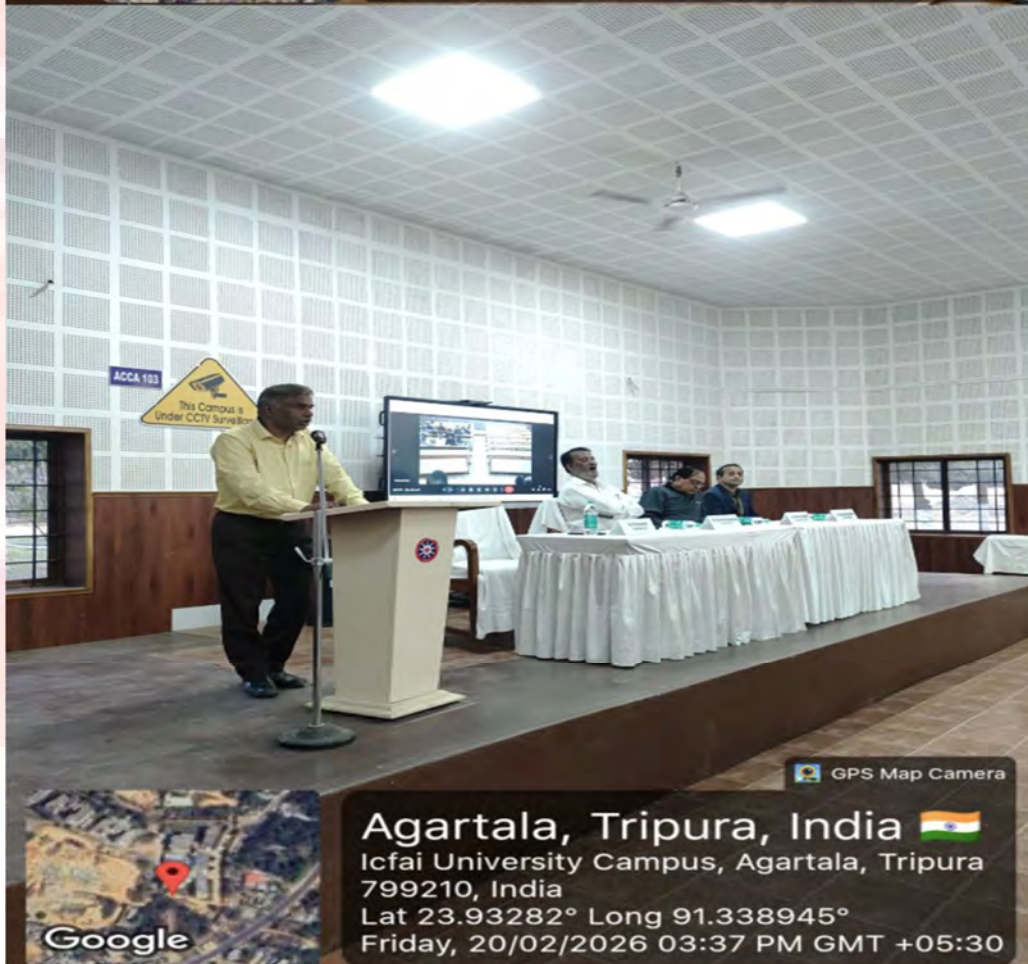

1. What difficulties you faced while pursuing your research?

Response: During my research, managing time between coursework and research was initially challenging; however, by prioritizing tasks and maintaining a structured schedule, I was able to balance both effectively. Additionally, I had difficulty accessing recent research articles, but with my supervisor's guidance and support, I was able to obtain the necessary resources and gain access to relevant journals. This helped me stay up to date and significantly enhanced the quality of my research.

2. How does your work align with contemporary trends or funding priorities?

Response: My work aligns well with contemporary trends and funding priorities, as cybersecurity is a critical global focus due to the increasing reliance on digital systems and rising cyber threats. My research contributes to this by addressing security challenges using modern approaches, supporting the growing emphasis on secure, resilient, and trustworthy digital infrastructure.

3. How did you balance your time? If several challenges came up, how would you prioritize?

Response: As a full-time PhD scholar, my primary focus was always on research and on producing quality publications rather than quantity. Even when there was coursework load or other activities, I consistently prioritized my research by managing my time

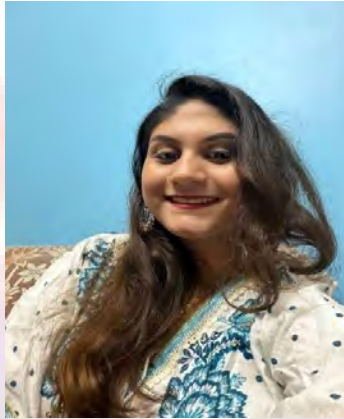
effectively and maintaining a disciplined schedule. I made it a point to set aside regular, consistent time for research, ensuring steady progress despite multiple challenges.

4. What were the sources you rely on mainly for your thesis writing?

Response: For my thesis, I primarily relied on recent relevant theses on **Shodhganga**, which provided valuable guidance on structure, methodology, and writing style. I further followed relevant SCI-indexed journal articles to ensure strong technical depth and overall quality.

5. What were your major focuses as a researcher?

Response: As a researcher, my primary focus was conducting high-quality, impactful research in cybersecurity, with an emphasis on developing effective, reliable solutions. I also prioritized publishing in reputed journals, maintaining strong methodological rigor, and ensuring that my work contributes to both academic knowledge and real-time applications.



Dr. Debadrita Dev

1. What difficulties you faced while pursuing your research?

Response: While pursuing my research, I faced several challenges. One of the main difficulties was collecting reliable and sufficient primary data from respondents, as many participants were hesitant or had limited time to provide detailed information. Accessing updated literature and relevant secondary data also required significant effort. Additionally, coordinating field visits and managing time between academic responsibilities and research work posed challenges. Despite these difficulties, careful planning and persistence helped in successfully completing the research.

2. How does your work align with contemporary trends or funding priorities?

Response: My research aligns with contemporary trends and funding priorities by focusing on women entrepreneurship and financial inclusion through the Self-Help Group (SHG)–Bank Linkage Programme. In recent years, government and various aligned agencies have emphasized on strengthening rural livelihoods, promoting women-led enterprises, and expanding access to formal financial services. By examining how SHGs facilitate entrepreneurship and economic participation among rural women, my work contributes to current policy priorities related to inclusive growth, sustainable rural development, financial autonomy of women entrepreneurs and overall growth of the economy.

3. How did you balance your time? If several challenges came up, how would you prioritize?

Response: Balancing time during my research required careful planning and setting clear priorities. I created a structured schedule to manage different stages of the research such as literature review, data collection, analysis, and writing. Whenever multiple challenges arose, I prioritized tasks based on their urgency and importance, focusing first on activities that directly impacted the progress of the research. Maintaining discipline, setting realistic deadlines, and staying organized helped me manage my responsibilities effectively and ensure the timely completion of my work.

4. What were the sources you rely on mainly for your thesis writing?

Response: The main sources relied upon for my thesis writing included academic journals, research articles, theses, books, government reports, and official publications related to the study area. Reputed databases and scholarly platforms like SCOPUS, Google scholar were used to access peer-reviewed literature to ensure the credibility of the information. In addition, reports from financial institutions like NABARD, TRML provided practical insights and statistical data relevant to the research topic. These sources helped in building a strong theoretical foundation and supporting the analysis with authentic and reliable information.

5. What were your major focuses as a researcher?

Response: My major research focus has been on assessing the performance of women entrepreneurs, particularly those associated with Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and the SHG-Bank Linkage Programme in India. A key aspect of my work involves the creation of a performance index to measure and evaluate the performance of the women entrepreneurs based on financial, marketing and training aspect. By developing and applying this index, the research aims to provide a structured and quantitative framework to understand how financial inclusion, institutional support, and access to banking services influence the growth and effectiveness of women-led enterprises.



Dr. Sankha Subhra Deb

Assistant Professor, IUT

1. What difficulties you faced while pursuing your research?

Response: Well to be honest, I faced several challenges some academic, some emotional, and some caused by my laptop deciding to update at the worst possible time. Getting a relevant topic was the first hurdle, because every idea seemed brilliant at midnight and questionable by morning. Collecting reliable data was another challenge, as respondents often disappear faster than deadlines approach. Accessing quality journals and previous studies required patience, persistence, and occasionally detective level searching skills. Time management was also difficult, especially balancing research with other academic responsibilities. Data analysis sometimes felt like solving a puzzle where half the pieces were missing. However, these challenges helped me develop patience, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills. In the end, PhD taught me that success is 10% hard work, 20% persistence, and the rest convincing myself that everything is under control.

2. How does your work align with contemporary trends or funding priorities?

Response: My research on behavioral biases in equity investment aligns very well with contemporary trends and funding priorities because today's financial markets are driven not only by fundamentals, but also by human behavior. Investors often make decisions influenced by overconfidence, herd mentality, loss aversion, panic selling, and the all too famous "my friend said this stock will double" strategy. At present, institutions, policymakers, and FinTech companies are giving increasing importance to investor psychology, financial

literacy, risk awareness, and retail investor protection. My work contributes to these priorities by examining why investors sometimes act irrationally and how such biases affect equity investment decisions. This is especially relevant in an era of app-based trading, social media stock tips, and instant market reactions. My research matches modern priorities because while markets look digital and sophisticated, many decisions are still made by emotions in a business suit.

3. How did you balance your time? If several challenges came up, how would you prioritize?

Response: I balanced my time by maintaining a proper schedule, setting priorities, and breaking the research into manageable stages such as literature review, data collection, analysis, and report writing. This helped me stay consistent and prevented the dangerous academic habit of believing “I still have plenty of time” until suddenly I did not. I also used deadlines as motivation and made weekly targets to track progress. Along with research, I ensured that my regular academic responsibilities were managed efficiently. In short, I tried to make my calendar work harder than I did. If several challenges came up at once, I would prioritize them based on urgency, importance, and impact. Immediate deadlines or critical research issues would be handled first, while less urgent matters would be scheduled next. I believe multitasking often means doing many things badly, so I prefer smart prioritization and focused execution.

4. What were the sources you rely on mainly for your thesis writing?

Response: The main sources I relied on for my thesis writing were research journals, academic books, published articles, company reports, stock market data, and credible financial websites related to behavioral finance and equity investment. Platforms such as Google Scholar, Research Gate, and peer-reviewed journal databases were especially useful for understanding theories and reviewing previous studies. I also referred to annual reports, market publications and financial news sources to connect academic concepts with real market behavior. Since my research focused on behavioral biases, studying how investors react during market highs, lows, and panic moments was highly relevant. After all, nothing explains investor psychology better than watching people buy at peaks and sell at bottoms.

5. What were your major focuses as a researcher?

Response:My major focus was to understand how behavioral biases influence equity investment decisions and why investors often behave like financial experts on Monday and confused philosophers by Friday. I concentrated on biases such as overconfidence, herd behavior, loss aversion, anchoring, and emotional decision making basically the reasons people buy high, sell low, and still blame the market. I also focused on collecting reliable data, using proper research methods, and ensuring that the findings were both academically sound and practically useful. It was important for me to connect textbook theories with what actually happens in the market, where logic sometimes takes a tea break. Another key focus was to understand that investing is not only about numbers, ratios, and charts, it is also about fear, greed, patience, impatience, and occasionally someone buying a stock because their cousin recommended it.



Dr. Manish Sarma

Assistant Professor, IUT

1. What difficulties you faced while pursuing your research?

Response: One of the primary challenges encountered during this research was the limited accessibility and archival availability of Bengali magazines from the 1990s, many of which are not systematically digitized or preserved. This necessitated extensive manual collection and verification of primary materials, often from scattered and non-catalogued sources. Additionally, the heterogeneity of content—ranging from editorials to advertisements and literary narratives—posed methodological complexities in maintaining analytical consistency within a discourse analysis framework. Another significant difficulty lay in contextualizing media representations within the rapidly transforming socio-economic landscape of 1990s Bengal, which required careful interdisciplinary engagement with history, cultural studies, and media theory to avoid reductive interpretations.

2. How does your work align with contemporary trends or funding priorities?

Response: The research aligns closely with contemporary academic and funding priorities that emphasize interdisciplinary approaches, cultural studies, and media analysis in understanding societal transformations. In an era marked by globalization and digital media proliferation, there is increasing scholarly interest in examining historical media forms to trace the evolution of popular culture and identity formation. By focusing on discourse analysis of print media within a specific socio-economic context, this study contributes to

ongoing debates on media as both a reflective and constitutive force in society. Furthermore, its engagement with themes such as globalization, liberalization, and cultural shifts resonates with broader research agendas concerned with postcolonial modernity and regional cultural dynamics.

3. How did you balance your time? If several challenges came up, how would you prioritize?

Response: Time management in this research was achieved through a structured and phased approach, dividing the work into stages such as textual analysis, theoretical framing, and writing. Priority was consistently given to the acquisition and organization of primary materials, as these formed the foundation of the study. In the face of multiple challenges, tasks were prioritized based on their immediacy and impact on the overall research progression; for instance, securing rare archival materials took precedence over secondary literature review. A flexible yet disciplined schedule allowed for adjustments when unforeseen difficulties arose, ensuring that critical components of the research were addressed without compromising analytical depth.

4. What were the sources you rely on mainly for your thesis writing?

Response: The thesis primarily relies on a diverse corpus of Bengali *Desh* magazines published during the 1990s, which served as the central primary sources for discourse analysis. These include a wide range of content such as feature articles, editorials, advertisements, and literary contributions that collectively represent the cultural milieu of the period. In addition, the study draws extensively on secondary sources, including scholarly works on popular culture, media studies, and theories of globalization and cultural transformation. The integration of theoretical frameworks from cultural theorists and media scholars provided the necessary conceptual grounding to interpret the primary texts within a broader socio-historical context.

5. What were your major focuses as a researcher?

Response: The central focus of this research was to critically examine how Bengali magazines of the 1990s functioned as cultural texts that both reflected and shaped emerging popular culture amidst a period of significant socio-economic transformation. Particular attention was given to identifying recurring themes, discursive patterns, and representational strategies within the media content. Another key focus was the interplay between global influences and local cultural expressions, especially in the context of liberalization and changing media landscapes. Ultimately, the research sought to foreground the role of print media as an active agent in constructing cultural narratives, rather than merely serving as a passive mirror of societal change.

1. What difficulties did you face while pursuing your research?

Response: During the course of my research, I encountered several challenges:

- i. Accessing both government and non-government schools in Tripura was time-consuming due to administrative permissions and varying levels of cooperation from institutions.
- ii. Physical education personnel often had busy schedules, which made it difficult to gather responses within a fixed timeline.
- iii. Some schools were located in remote areas, making travel and communication difficult.
- iv. Ensuring honest responses regarding job satisfaction was challenging, as some respondents were hesitant to express dissatisfaction.
- v. Balancing and comparing variables like facilities, programs, and job satisfaction between two different systems required careful standardization of tools and interpretation.

2. How does your work align with contemporary trends or funding priorities?

Response: My research aligns with current trends in:

- i. There is growing emphasis on improving school infrastructure and co-curricular programs, including physical education.

- ii. Modern educational research prioritizes teacher satisfaction as it directly influences performance and student outcomes.
- iii. Governments and educational bodies are increasingly focusing on evidence-based policy-making, especially in improving disparities between government and private institutions.
- iv. The study supports the global shift toward integrating physical education as a vital component of overall student development.

Thus, the study provides valuable insights for policymakers, educational planners, and funding agencies aiming to improve physical education systems.

3. How did you balance your time? If several challenges came up, how would you prioritize?

Response: I followed a systematic research schedule, dividing my work into phases such as literature review, tool preparation, data collection, analysis, and writing.

I used time management strategies like setting weekly targets and maintaining a research diary.

When multiple challenges arose, I prioritized tasks based on:

- i. Urgency (deadlines)
- ii. Importance (impact on research progress)
- iii. For example, data collection was given top priority during the fieldwork phase, while writing and editing were prioritized later.
- iv. I also maintained flexibility to adapt to unforeseen issues, such as delays in data collection.

4. What were the sources you relied on mainly for your thesis writing?

Response: The major sources I relied on include:

- i. Peer-reviewed journals related to physical education, sports sciences, and educational management.
- ii. Standard references on measurement, evaluation, and sports psychology.

- iii. Especially those related to school education and physical education programs in India and Tripura.
- iv. Previous research studies provided a foundation for methodology and conceptual framework.
- v. Such as Google Scholar, Research Gate, and institutional repositories.
- vi. Collected directly from physical education personnel using questionnaires.

5. What were your major focuses as a researcher?

Response: As a researcher, my primary focuses were:

- i. Identifying differences between government and non-government schools in terms of facilities, programs, and job satisfaction.
- ii. Ensuring reliability and validity in data collection and analysis.
- iii. Making the findings useful for improving physical education systems in Tripura.
- iv. Examining not just infrastructure, but also human factors like job satisfaction.
- v. Providing recommendations that can help bridge gaps between different types of schools.
